# Village allocation

- All scout groups has received an email about which other groups there are in your village.
- The email includes contact details for each group's designated contact person.

- Every group must bring own tents for sleeping.

# Hygiene

The Jamboree26 way



- **Toilets**

- Both flush toilets and dry toilets
- Urinals
- Accessible toilets

- **Showers**

- Shower trailers all with individual stalls
- Accessible showers

- **Hygiene in the village**

- Tooth brushing
- Hand washing, face washing

# Water and waste

The Jamboree26 way



- **Water**
  - Collect in containers from the water stations.
- **Greywater**
  - Gather in a suitable container in the village and take to designated disposal points on the camp site.
  - All water must be filtered so that no food waste is included.
- **Waste sorting**
  - Plastic packaging
  - Paper/cardboard packaging
  - Metal packaging
  - Food waste
  - Residual waste
  - Corrugated cardboard
  - Coloured glass
  - Clear glass

# Poles, Gas and Firewood

The Jamboree26 way

- **Poles**
  - 1 pole per participant
- **Gas**
  - The current limit is 60 litres (2 P11 cylinders). More information will be provided depending on village size.
  - Coordination with the emergency services is ongoing.
  - Gas cylinder exchange will be available (details on models and pricing will be shared later).
- **Firewood**
  - Jamboree26 does not provide firewood.
  - The past summers there has been a fire ban.
  - Prepare an alternative way of cooking.



# Safety

The Jamboree26 way



- **Safety planning**
  - Contingency planning and risk management is ongoing.
- **Safety hosts on site**
  - Collaboration with the police and emergency services.
- **Medical care at the camp**
  - Scout groups are responsible for basic first aid themselves.
  - Health care volunteers are on site to assist with more serious injuries and illnesses.
  - Defibrillators are available on the field.
- **Listening Ears**
  - Support for children and young people.
  - A trusted adult to talk to.

# Travel sustainably with your group

- Go by train to **Kristianstad C**
- Local transport: **Skånetrafiken**
  - Stop: Norra Åsum Wendesgymnasiet
  - We will send more information regarding timetables.
- No shuttle buses are provided by the **Jamboree26**

# Travel with car or bus

## Arrival with Trailer

- Entry on the 24 July, the day before the jamboree starts, is permitted between 08:00–20:00.
- Drivers and passengers may stay overnight in their subcamp. Expect limited services and arrange your own food.
- Trailers may remain in the subcamp as they are then considered tents and then must follow the same spacing rules as tents.
- Entry during the camp period is also possible.

## Arrival with Bus

Arrival with bus to designated parking area for buses.

The group unloads and transports the equipment to their subcamp themselves.

## Departure with Trailer

- It is possible to roll empty trailers into the area if the established rules are followed.
- No loaded trailers may be moved by hand within the area.

# Shipping goods

- The scout group books transport with delivery between 13–21 July and pickup between 3–7 August.
- The camp will transport the goods to your village.
- Items must be packed on pallets with pallet collars and a lid, maximum 7 collars high, with no parts sticking out.
- Pack everything to be weatherproof, as it will be stored outdoors on the field.
- Packing materials are stored in the village during the camp week.

# Food philosophy Jamboree26

Food that tastes good and that I look forward to.  
Food that gives me the energy for adventures.

Theme is Together.

Good food shouldn't taste weird — and  
it shouldn't harm the planet either.



# Food philosophy Jamboree26

**All groups cook the food for themselves.**

- We want to inspire positive eating habits by encouraging a more sustainable food system.
- Eating in an environmentally friendly way can appear more familiar than we might think.

## **How?**

Fixed recipes, but with room to make your own variations.

A varied menu, with both meat and vegetarian options.

We aim to introduce meals and ingredients that may be completely or partly new to our scouts — for example, swapping rice for Swedish-grown oat grains.

# Food distribution

- Food is collected at the assigned time for your village.
- In general, you pick up the items yourselves.
- Some food items are handed out in fixed quantities over the counter, for example protein items.
- Staple items are collected on the first day of the camp and then restocked as needed.

# and refrigerated containers

- Villages located near each other share the same refrigerated container.
- Chilled items should be placed in the container.
- Other food is stored in the village.
- Leftovers can also be stored in the refrigerated containers to reduce food waste.

# Dietary restrictions

The Jamboree26 way

Update dietary  
information  
in your registration.



- It shouldn't be complicated to manage dietary restrictions at camp.
- The food distribution area has a special diets section where registered dietary needs can be collected.
- You may be contacted by the food team if your group has specific allergies or dietary restrictions.
- Gluten-free, lactose-free, milk protein-free, vegetarian, vegan, nuts, legumes, eggs — no problem.

# Programme and the Together Party

# Time for arrival and departure

## Jamboree26 starts 25 July

- You may arrive at any time during Saturday — groups will be arriving throughout the day.
- If you are bringing equipment by car and trailer, this need to arrive one day earlier.
- The first meal at the jamboree will be dinner.
- The official opening ceremony will take place on Sunday July 26th.

## Jamboree26 closes 1 August

- The amazing closing ceremony will take place on Friday evening.
- On Saturday, there is no set schedule and groups may leave the camp whenever suitable.
- The final meal of the camp will be lunch on Saturday.
  - It will be something easily prepared and to go.

# Programme and weekly schedule

## Programme activities in patrols every day.

- Patrols of 4–7 participants.
- Activity sessions take place either in the morning or the afternoon.
- Discoverers (10-11) must have a leader, Adventurers (12-15) should have a leader.

## Programme is divided into 5 themes .

- One for each full day of the camp .
- One is located in Kristianstad city.

The hubs are open for most of the day.



# Hubs

The Jamboree26 way

- Social areas for each age group. Meet friends, play games, hang out.
- Some evenings offer activities like karaoke and disco.
- Shop at the café.

Card payments are mainly used throughout the camp.



# The Together Party

- On Tuesday evening, it's time for the Together Party — everyone helps create the celebration!
- It's all about togetherness, co-creation, and joy.
- Each scout group can make their own part to the party.
- How can you contribute?  
Choose one or more:  
*Food, drinks, music, dance, performances, costumes, games, decorations, or capturing memories!*

- Examples of things your village can do:
  - Small tasting samples that can be eaten from a mug or by hand
  - Offer an exciting drink
  - Games and competitions, perhaps using recycled materials
  - Organise a dance parade through the village
  - Face painting
  - Music in different forms
  - Decorations that make your space feel magical

# Important things to keep in mind for the Together Party

- No alcohol is permitted at any time during the jamboree.
- Use recycled and second-hand materials whenever possible. Avoid single-use items.
- Food and drinks must have a clear list of ingredients.
- No sharp objects may be thrown.
- Any type of open fire must be reported to Safety and follow their guidelines.
- Have a clear plan for waste and rubbish.
- Leaders are responsible for their scouts, as usual.
- Make sure no one goes missing, is left alone, or behaves in a way that creates an unsafe situation for themselves or others.
- Listening Ears will be available, and safety hosts will be present around the area.

# Programme for Rovers

The Jamboree26 way



- For leaders and volunteers aged 18–25.
- Separate opening and closing ceremonies.
- Programme sessions are offered both in the morning and afternoon — you can join whenever it fits your other responsibilities.
- Activities may also be available later in the Rover Hub.
- All Rovers are welcome, whether you signed up for it or not!
