

Packing list for scout groups

Safety and recycling

The following things are needed in your village. Talk to the troops you will live with on who brings what.

- First aid kit (see Appendix 1).
- Two portable fire extinguishers of at least 6 kg each, either foam or powder.
- Red battery-powered light to mark the fire extinguishers at night.
- At least one fire blanket to be placed by the cooking area.
- At least one laminated sign marking the location of gas cylinders in the kitchen area (see Appendix 2).
- A measuring tape or rope measuring 4 meters, with a marking at 3 meters, to measure safety distances.
- Bucket or similar large liquids container and a colander for greywater. *Food waste is composted, and remaining liquid is poured into collection containers at the camp.*
- Containers for recycling. The following materials are recyclable by sorting them: plastic packaging, paper packaging, corrugated cardboard, metal packaging, coloured glass, clear glass, food waste, and residual waste.

Food logistics and cooking

Most of the following things are needed in your village. Talk to the troops you will live with on who brings what.

- Wagon for transporting food between the food distribution point and the village.
- Larger box or crate for transport as a complement to the wagon.
- Larger boxes, buckets, or similar for carrying loose items, such as fruit and vegetables.
- Smaller boxes, lunchboxes, or containers with lids for special diets, leftovers, and opened packages.
- Smaller containers and bags for storing leftovers and unused ingredients. *Refrigerated items must be placed in packaging before being put into the crate in the refrigerated container.*
- Bowls, serving dishes, and platters for serving.
- Other kitchen equipment: pots, frying pans, ladles, spatulas, knives, graters, colanders, and other items the troop needs for cooking.
- Spices to allow you to make your own variations of the meals served. *Spices required for the planned recipes are provided at the food distribution point. We recommend reviewing the menu before packing.*
- The jamboree provides villages with 500 grams of ground coffee per 40 people. If you wish to consume more than this, we recommend bringing extra or trading with a neighboring village.
- Villages must bring their own consumables such as coffee filters, paper towels, cloths, dish brushes, and foil. *We value our shared sustainability efforts and recommend purchasing eco-labeled products.*
- Personal lunchbox with a tightly sealed lid for all scouts and leaders, *for the packed lunch on the journey home, which can be used for lunch on arrival day as well depending on your troops own plans.*

Other

- One “building block” for the Together Party (Tillsammansfesten) (see Appendix 3 or jamboree.se/english/scout-group/together-party).
- For the Adventurers’ programme (ages 12-14): one empty toilet paper roll per participant.
- Earplugs or hearing protection. *This is recommended for everyone during large stage events, but especially important for those who are sensitive to sound.*
- Firewood for troops that wish to have a campfire. *As long as there is no fire ban in effect.*

Fun items for the troop to bring

- Something that symbolizes “Together” and can be safely hung up. *At Jamboree26, there will be a tree that all villages help decorate together. This could be a troop neckerchief, a troop pennant, or another symbol representing your troop. Whatever you create or bring must be suitable for hanging in a tree—the Together Tree.*
- Crank radio. *FM radio will be broadcast at Jamboree26.*
- Face paint. *The hubs invite you to some parade and discos during the week where face paint can be a mood-boosting activity regardless of age.*
- Pink clothes/things for the challengers. *The Challenger Hub thinks it would be fun if challengers distinguished themselves with pink during the major events such as the opening, parade and closing.*
- Pyjamas. *For pyjama parties at the various hubs.*

Do not bring

- Drones. *To ensure a safe and secure environment for everyone, drones are not allowed. The jamboree organization will operate approved drones for aerial photography of the camp area, as well as during larger events.*

Appendix 1: First aid kit

Below is the content recommended by Jamboree26 for a troop first aid kit. This is also listed in the Care Handbook (Vårdhandboken). The full handbook can be found on the website jamboree.se or via a previous newsletter.

Paracetamol, 1 package (must cover the number of participants in the troop)
Glucose tablets
Thermometer
First aid dressings / pressure bandages, at least 2 (one large, one small, both blood-stopping)
Hand sanitizer
Gloves
Ibuprofen, 1 package (must cover the number of participants in the troop)
Compresses
Adhesive tape (Leukoplast)
Bandage wraps, at least 2
Menstrual products
Face masks, 1 package
Tweezers and tick remover
Plasters
Scissors
Blister plasters
Sunscreen (scouts should bring their own, but it is good to have extra)
Steri-Strips (wound closure strips)
Wound cleanser
Oral rehydration salts
Eye wash (saline/NaCl also works)

Appendix 3: The Together Party (Tillsammansfesten)

To keep things simple, troops can choose one or more of the party's "building blocks": Food, Drinks, Music, Dance, Performances, Costumes, Games, Decorations, and Capture the Moments. You decide what you want to create—big or small, calm or high-energy. Everything counts!

Examples of what you can contribute:

- Small tastings served in a mug
- A tea bar or refreshing drinks on tap
- Games and competitions made from reused materials
- A dance parade through the village
- A face-painting or accessory station
- A photo corner or Polaroid camera
- Music with live instruments or a DJ booth
- Decorations that make your space magical

Keep in mind:

- All ingredients must be clearly listed in both Swedish and English
- Food must not be served in single-use plastic items
- Use recycled and second-hand materials whenever possible
- Avoid single-use products and materials that create litter
- Provide clear waste sorting solutions at your activity
- Fire performances must be registered with the jamboree organization in advance, follow specific safety requirements, and will be cancelled in case of a fire ban
- Sharp objects must not be thrown
